Homework:

Preschooler's will take home a 'Story in a Bag.' Please set some time aside to listen to your little one retell a story, or make a story up with the items in the bag. After hearing your child tell his/her story, ask meaningful and open-ended questions. For example, "What was your favorite part of the story and why?", "What do you think might happen if...?", "How is this story the same/different than the last story?" Asking open-ended questions helps children expand and develop their comprehension, vocabulary and language skills.
